A couple of events that our committee was involved with during the summer:

On July 13th. we were very fortunate to have a tour of the Essex Windsor Solid Waste Authority Recycling facilities. We had @ 50 participants made up of our own CAW Local 200 Environment Committee and citizens from the local community. Dave Semus and Heather Taylor from the EWSWA put on a great tour educating the people on the importance of recycling and how to do it properly. For the very young participants they put on special activities to allow the children to learn how to recycle while at the same time keeping them out of harm's way on the actual tour of the recycling process.

On August 21st and 28th Yellow fish road events were put on jointly between our CAW Local 200 and 444 Environment committees, the Detroit River Canadian Clean up Committee and the City of Windsor.

The Nemark announcement went very good, I want to thank our members for ratifying this agreement in principal it will keep 200 jobs in our community that other wise would have ended up in Mexico or one of the Southern States. We secured the future of the plant and the work will come to Windsor.

We have had some discussions around EEP, they seem interested in the Melt Shop only. The coverage from the Star was shoddy at best a lot of wrong info was put out there, they reported that the people in that plant were taking a big pay cut and that there was melting going on in the EAP both statements not factual.

The 5.0 Engine volumes at EEP continue to grow and stands around 270,000 units as of now. We are having discussions with Ford on component work we will keep everyone updated if any thing comes out of it.

The Penske unit is having issues with manpower etc. we will be getting involved with them. Dan spoke about the Municipal Elections and how we need to be supporting labor friendly candidates. The media is out there distorting facts. If you can please get involved and help these candidates out.

Dan spoke about the issue with the Chrysler workers in the states and all the bad press around that it is just disgusting what the press did there. Everyone needs to be careful what you do on company property.
