We have 132 working in the Nemark Unit.

Chris talked about the 3 valve head machining being shutdn while out side supplier was still running we have to look into it, and when we get the 2nd Mod up and running we will not need Comtech Heads anymore. Also lots of issues with 5.0 Block if it's not Nemark that cannot keep up then its Romeo the company wants our new Block Line up and running ASAP.

Cleveland and Lima are struggling to keep up with demand of the V-6; Cleveland is not having a shut dn. this yr.

We have concerns with the V-6 commodity engine out selling V-8 in F150 for 1st time ever.

Ford is demanding that dealers place orders with 60% V-6's in them, Ford is not marketing the 5.0 in the F150 there are no markings on Truck what so ever, but the V-6 F150 have markings all over it.

Very concerned about WEP future it will be in jeopardy in 2014 we will raise with Bickens and Tetrault at next meeting.

The company is very concerned about Comp. Issues because premiums are going up, so Ford is watching very closely. They are doing everything they can to get people denied Benefits, make sure you report all injuries asap. The company is forcing injured workers back to work, also if your on comp be careful because they will be watching you.

At Nemark the South Line launch is not going well at all they have laid off 16 people that will get called back as soon as we can get it running, I met with Lloyd and he says G.M. is screaming, and it could hurt our future business.

At Penske and Voith we are going through Amendments we have to set up meeting with Oakville. In Oct we will start Barg. with Voith and in Dec. we will start Barg with Penske, there are some tough issues to get through but I'am looking forward to it.

On the Provincial Election: Hudak is out there and all he is talking about is Tax Man McGuinty but not talking about what his platform is, this Party is very dangerous and we need to do everything we can to stop them from winning in the Fall. We will be asking for everyone's help in this election.

Sandra Pupatello will be a big loss for us, no matter what party she was in she helped us out big time down here with Ford and Nemark.

We are monitoring the UAW Barg. but it is really quiet not hearing much of anything at this point.

The UAW is trying to organize the Hyundai plant but are having very little success, 80% of folks working there do not want a Union and are making a decent wage and benefits it will be tough to win them over.

We have 2 recommendations

- 1) Cancel July and Aug meeting.
- 2) \$125,000 to replace roof.

We must have the roof done by Nov. 1 or we will not be able to insure the building.

Recommendations were moved supported and passed.

I want to thank everyone for their support through this transition it has made it a lot easier with everyone's support.
